

Sovereignty Boundary Model

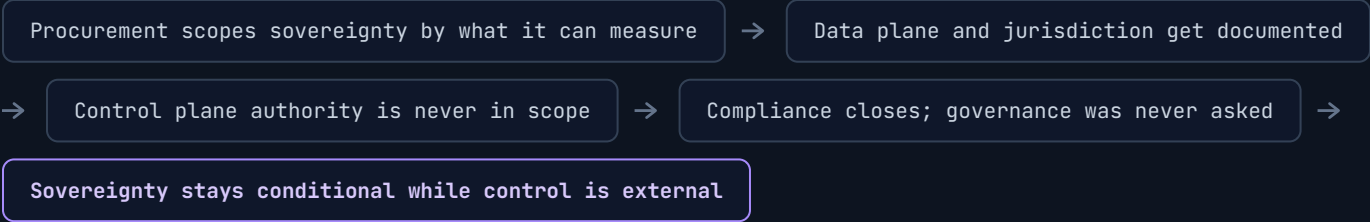
DEFINITION

A model defining where sovereignty control must actually be enforced — control plane, data plane, jurisdiction — before sovereignty architecture work can begin.

FRAMEWORK FLOW

01 The Condition Sovereignty initiatives are scoped by procurement, legal, and compliance — teams equipped to document data residency and vendor certifications, not to ask who controls runtime behavior.	02 The Boundary The scope collapses around what those functions can measure. Control plane authority never appears in a DPA, a SOC 2 audit, or a GDPR checklist.	03 The Closure The program declares sovereignty achieved when its measurable compliance conditions are satisfied. No independent test confirms who controls runtime behavior.	04 Consequence Infrastructure is documented as sovereign while external vendor endpoints retain operational authority. Compliance is real; sovereignty remains conditional.
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Failure State: Sovereign-by-Documents, Governed Externally



THE DIAGNOSTIC SIGNAL

SCOPE ORIGIN

Sovereignty initiatives launched by legal, procurement, or compliance inherit that function's scope boundary — and none of those boundaries include runtime authority.

THE THREE BOUNDARIES

Control plane, data plane, and jurisdiction are three distinct enforcement boundaries. Compliance frameworks primarily establish evidence around data handling and jurisdiction; they do not by themselves establish runtime control-plane authority.

INHERITANCE PATTERN

Guardrail services, observability pipelines, and identity providers already in the stack before sovereignty became a requirement are accepted by default — nobody's scope ever included them.

CLOSURE CRITERION

Procurement-led programs close when compliance is satisfied. Runtime-governance-led programs close when operational authority is confirmed. Those are different programs.

FRAMEWORK HOME

Sovereignty programs close when compliance is satisfied. Whether runtime authority is under local governance was never the question the program was designed to ask.

"If the control plane remains external, sovereignty remains conditional. The compliance posture can be real and the operational authority can be absent at the same time."
